A YEAR OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

This year has been filled with meaningful endeavors that continue to make our community better.

In an effort to encourage giving through payroll deduction, the CFSNM partnered with the City of Las Cruces to launch the first-ever payroll giving campaign. The program allowed City employees to explore organizations and causes they were passionate about, and choose to give at amounts starting at \$2.50 per paycheck. Employees were able to choose whether they wanted their gift to support one of the 23 direct service partner endowments housed at the CFSNM, the Wellness Fund Grant Program, or five different scholarships. This collaboration has allowed the CFSNM to cultivate a new cohort of philanthropists in our community.

Finding ways to further student success was made possible thanks to our donors who have established scholarships at the CFSNM. In 2018, over 130 students applied for the 30 scholarships available through the Foundation. This bright group of young adults showcased all we want to see in our leaders of tomorrow—drive, determination, and the desire to make our community and the world they live in a better place.

CFSNM Grant Programs continue to impact nonprofit organizations doing life-changing work in our southern New Mexico communities. Over \$190,000 has been granted out to support maternal and child health, the arts, hunger, and other programs making a difference in southern New Mexico.

CFSNM is also committed to new endeavors to support state-wide grantmaking in LGBTQ initiatives through the Envision Fund, random acts of kindness programming and being an active member in planning for the upcoming Census 2020. We are proud of our partnerships and engaging the organization as the backbone community impact leader for the Doña Ana Wellness Institute. This role will not only keep our foundation connected to our healthcare history, but also allow us to guide systemic change for our Doña Ana County residents.
