ROLE OF FINANCE AND INVESTMENT COMMITTEE AND INVESTMENT POLICY





Its primary duties include developing investment policies, overseeing the management of assets, and ensuring the financial strategies focus on growth and impact moving forward. This group of dedicated Board Members and Emeritus Board Members of CFSNM meet quarterly to review investment performance, manage risks, and ensure compliance with relevant laws and regulations.

The dollars awarded each year from earnings impacts a large breadth and depth of our community nonprofits. On an annual basis, the Board of Directors along with our Finance and Investment Committee review policy and investment numbers to determine the percentage pay out. This is an important piece of our work and allows our team the ability to award scholarships, grants and gift directly to projects that address community needs and elevate important work that uplifts our communities in Southern New Mexico.



- With Board of Director and committee support, our team reviewed and completed a new partnership with our investment partners Merrill Lynch The Fletcher Group.



The Rainbow Committee will continue to expand its impact and outreach efforts over the next five years.









ANNOUNCING RURAL ROOTS

The CFSNM has had the tremendous opportunity to partner with American AgCredit. The Association has allocated a \$10 million gift to begin the Rural Roots Endowment. The endowment will be focused on the future of agriculture with a commitment to supporting farmers, ranchers, and our neighbors who live and work in New Mexico. In partnership with the Rural Roots Endowment, a Board of Advisors team with support from CFSNM will be able to impact all counties in New Mexico. Our team will be traveling throughout NM to ensure grant opportunities are brought to the Board of Advisors annually from each corner of our beautiful state.



GENERATIONAL IMPACT

Your Community Foundation will serve as a fiduciary nonprofit partner for these funds. The growth endowment will be in perpetuity, which will allow the Board of Advisors of the Rural Roots Endowment to fund agricultural work for generations to come. Grant funds will be released in 2024 and will focus on providing grants and direct funds to New Mexico agricultural organizations such as New Mexico youth organizations (FFA, 4H, junior livestock, scholarships, etc.); protecting New Mexico agriculture; fighting hunger in New Mexico; and continuing ag education in New Mexico. Our team and Board of Directors are honored to have received this partnership gift and know these funds will impact our communities for generations to come.

Celebrating and Sustaining Our Nonprofit Partners

NONPROFIT IMPACT

Your CFSNM strives to support nonprofit capacity building for 12 counties in Southern New Mexico. This is done through grant funding, one-on-one support, and partnership and collaboration. Additionally, in 2023, we grew to house 48 nonprofit endowments that foster growth and sustainability of our nonprofit partners' vital work and missions.

In 2023, we were able to grow our impact for our nonprofit partners through our giving days, giving circles, grants, and more. With the unwavering support and generosity of our community, collectively, we raised over \$121,000 for Giving Tuesday! Thanks to a \$25,000 match by Tawney, Acosta & Chaparro P.C. Truck Crash & Injury Attorneys, we were able to support one of our nonprofit endowment partners, Casa de Peregrinos, in raising funds to support their mission and in sustaining their important work. This day also saw the success of fully endowing Ngage New Mexico's Nonprofit Endowment. Contributions to this national day of giving helped to foster growth and make a significant difference in creating access to resources and opportunities for people, programs, and initiatives across Southern New Mexico. These gifts provided a warm meal, a place for people to rest their head at night, care for people going through cancer treatment, access to education, and more.



In 2023, we were also able to award the first ever Youth in Philanthropy grant thanks to a generous gift from the Nusenda Credit Union Foundation. Our Youth in Philanthropy group, HandinHand, served as the committee to select two nonprofits to each receive a \$5,000 award.

THRIVING TOGETHER



It is true. We can go so much further together than if we go alone. 2023 saw nine grant cycles with a total of \$1,541,300 awarded to 52 grantees. This includes nonprofit partners, community programs, and local businesses. Your CFSNM team is honored and inspired by the work of our incredible community partner grantees, and in 2023, we had the opportunity to celebrate some incredible milestones and community partnerships!

The El Calvario commercial kitchen incubator is the only 24/7, accessible incubator kitchen in Southwestern New Mexico that welcomes entrepreneurs in the various stages of their food business or who are looking to expand their small-scale business. El Calvario received two grants in our 2023 grant cycles to support this program. The kitchen allows clients to use space and equipment at an affordable rate or free, which eliminates the costly overhead barrier that prevents many small businesses from starting or expanding. The program offers a six-week intensive course that helps launch new entrepreneurs, and it continues to provide services to program graduates, including renting the commercial kitchen, providing space to store their food trucks, or using the kitchen as a commissary, and aims to graduate 60 to 90 food entrepreneurs annually.

The impact of the El Calvario commercial kitchen program can be found in stories like Backyard Farms LLC, which operates freeze-dry technology that can preserve food for use for 25 years. Backyard Farms is a recipient of the 2023 Fulton Family Foundation Economic Revitalization and Retention Grant and the New Mexico Economic Development Grant which are held within CFSNM. At the initial stages of the operations of Backyard Farms LLC, El Calvario's commercial kitchen served as the place for keeping the machines that were used to experiment with the possibilities of freeze-drying technology. After the initial success, Backyard Farms has progressed to becoming an approved vendor of the New Mexico Grown Program. Using freeze dried technology and produce with surface imperfections that render it unsellable for small farmers, Backyard Farms turns the produce into delicious treats and meals, saving them from landfills and returning them to the food system, ultimately helping to provide valuable income to farmers. Freeze drying protects the nutrients of the food and Backyard Farms aims to supply these products to populations facing food insecurity across the state in schools, senior centers, daycare centers and tribal centers. In 2023, Rachael Ryan, the founder of Backyard Farms, was inducted into the NMSU Entrepreneur Hall of Fame!

In 2023, we celebrated five years of Southern New Mexico Giving Day and more than doubled our impact from the previous year! IMAGINATION LIBRARY OF GRANT COUNTY

Loren and Barbara Nelson have been instrumental in impacting our communities in SNM, specifically in the creation of the Imagination Library of Grant County. Our team has had the pleasure of working with both Loren and Barbara to ensure sustainability for the Imagination Library programming. Loren and Barbara were committed to having Imagination Library of Grant County impact children in each of the 33 counties of New Mexico and with their dedication this has become a reality. There are now children in every zip code of New Mexico that receive support from the Imagination Library of Grant County. Loren and Barbara continue to be steadfast donors and advocates for the program. In 2018, a permanent endowment of \$15,000 was set up to assist in the sustainability of programming statewide. Since then, the entire Board of Directors in partnership with Nancy Stephens, their Executive Director, have continued to educate the community on the importance of long-term planning. With collaboration and matching dollars from Southern New Mexico Giving Day and CFSNM Giving Tuesday the endowment is now reached the \$50,000 mark.

To honor their community impact, the Board of Directors for the Imagination Library of Grant County renamed their endowment in honor of Loren and Barbara Nelson. As a collaborative team, we want to thank Loren and Barbara Nelson for their commitment to children across our state. Thank you to the Imagination Library of Grant County Board of Directors for honoring Loren and Barbara's commitment. Let us all hope their dedication to dreaming more, learning more, and caring more will not only bring Dolly Parton to visit the Land of Enchantment but let us be inspired to make a lasting impact on our community.



RIVALS FOR RELIEF



We are so grateful to Rivals for Relief and the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico for their generosity. Their donation will help provide over 14,500 meals to our most vulnerable neighbors in the borderland. We can't thank them enough for supporting the fight against hunger. And with that, began the Rivals for Relief project. In 2023, Aggies, Lobos, and Miners partnered with your Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico to raise money that would support efforts to help asylum seekers at the southern border. Rivals for Relief was coordinated by Garrett Moseley who at the time was serving as a president of the Associated Students of New Mexico State University and now serves as the NMSU Student Regent. Garrett saw the asylum seekers at the border and wanted to ensure that each person was being received with compassion and had access to items of need, such as food. Garrett reached out to Ian May who was serving as the Associated Students of the University of New Mexico President and Gabbi Munoz who was serving as the president of UTEP Student Government Association, and they worked collaboratively to bring students from all three institutions together to fundraise in support of an organization helping with these efforts. Your CFSNM team joined Rivals for Relief to deliver the funds raised to the EI Pasoans Fighting Hunger Food Bank (EPFH). EPFH serves over 150,000 people in the borderland who are facing food-insecurity. Additionally, EPFH has supported asylum seekers by providing meals, distributing basic needs kits, and storing cots.

We are honored to hold and support the Rivals for Relief initiative. When communities and people come together, we really can make a difference!

SUPPORTING FAMILIES OF OFFICERS ACROSS THE US

There are moments in our lives that stir inspiration. Usually when we think back to these times, they are filled with creative thinking, hope, and enthusiasm. But from time to time, seeds for these ideas are also planted during times of tragedy. The Federal Probation and Pretrial Officer Benevolence Fund was established by Glynis Eaton and Amy Kord in honor of Glynis's husband, Brian, who passed away in 2018. In January of 2018, Brian left town to attend a work conference. For their family, it felt like any other work trip. However, they had no clue that was the last time they would get to hug their husband and father goodbye. Glynis received a call from Brian's coworkers that would forever change her life. Sadly, she learned that had Brian suffered a heart attack and passed away. "It took a few months to get myself to where I could even function-this was devastating for our whole family. Learning to be a widow was the hardest thing I have ever done," she said. The Federal Probation and Pretrial Officer Benevolence Fund was organized with the sole purpose of helping the families of sworn officers of U.S. Probation and Pretrial Services by providing financial relief in the event of an officer's death. Since its inception, the fund has benefited six families and continues to grow. "Part of our vision is that we want to get a check cut as soon as possible to give families a sense of security, so another week doesn't go by where they experience added stress," said Glynis. Families of officers who have passed away from cancer and car accidents have been recipients of the benevolence fund, and Glynis hopes the fund continues to be a resource for years to come. We have been incredibly moved by Glynis's story, and how despite her grief, she was motivated to make a difference for the families of fellow fallen officers.



COMMUNITY IMPACT



ADDRESSING THE GREATEST NEEDS OF OUR REGION, TOGETHER.

As we continue to expand our impact across the region, your support continues to allow Your Community Foundation to create lasting change in Southern New Mexico, supporting efforts and making a real impact in addressing the greatest needs in our region and elevating important work in education, economic development, social causes, community initiatives, and more.

The Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico (CFSNM) prioritizes listening and responding to community voices, challenges, and needs. This is what drives our strategic planning and work, as our focus is to strengthen our communities now and for generations to come.

CFSNM is the fiscal home for several community-driven programs and initiatives, including the 100% Community initiatives of the Anna, Age Eight Institute, Doña Ana Wellness Institute, Serving Seniors, and Artspace. Within each of these initiatives and programs, we actively engage in community lead conversations that address the needs of our region. In addition to serving as their fiscal home, staff are actively involved in Doña Ana County Resilience Leaders (DACRL), which serves as a branch of the Anna, Age Eight Institute, and an active participant of the Doña Ana Wellness Institute. The Serving Seniors of Southern New Mexico Charity Fund was founded in 2023 by Dr. Jesus Duran. This year, the Serving Seniors Golf Tournament successfully grew the fund to support more individuals in need. CFSNM works closely with other community leaders and direct service providers to address social determinants of health through these initiatives and through collaborative conversations and partnerships with various community coalitions and programs, including LC3 Behavioral Health Collaborative and the Doña Ana County Success Partnership. CFSNM is a proud partner of Borderplex Connect whose mission is to support and provide access to broadband internet, including without limitation internet services, access to devices and digital skills training the rural and/or underserved, economically challenged areas of Far West Texas and Southern New Mexico. In 2023, CFSNM was able to support 11 businesses through the Economic Development, Retention, and Revitiization (EDDRR) Grant. The EDRR Grant was established by a generous gift from the Stanley E. Fulton Family Foundation to CFSNM. The EDRR Grant is rooted in strengthening southern New Mexico through economic development, entrepreneurship, business retention, and revitalization of our economy.

Thanks to generous donors, community members, and partners, we are able to continue to support community initiatives that serve to provide access to resources and opportunities for our communities. This includes working with LCPS Staff to address the greatest needs of our students during the 2023 school year thanks to community members who have contributed gifts to CFSNM's Greatest Needs Impact Fund. We are also incredibly honored to support and house organizations such as Animal Companions of Las Cruces, La Mesa Lions Club Foundation, and the Grajeda Huckaby Low Barrier Housing Fund.

In 2023, we also saw the growth of our payroll giving programs with Electronic Caregiver and the City of Las Cruces and implemented our Food Truck Give Back Partnership with Acai With Me and had Leo's Far Out Tacos and Fancy Emilade join this partnership for Giving Tuesday. ANNA, AGE EIGHT INSTITUTE - 100% COMMUNITY



Your Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico is proud to be a fiscal home for the 100% Community initiatives of the Anna, Age Eight Institute. These initiatives work to ensure that 100% of New Mexican children, students, and families can thrive. The Anna, Age Eight Institute was established in 2019 with funding from the New Mexico state legislature and is sponsored by New Mexico State University. They use data-driven, collaborative approaches to reform the root causes of trauma in communities, bringing together leaders in the public and private sectors to address issues in several counties. In 2023, CFSNM has grown in fiscally sponsor 17 counites in their 100% Community Coalitions and Initiatives. The social determinants of health refer to the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work, and age that influence their health and well-being. These determinants are shaped by a range of factors, including social, economic, and environmental factors. Key social determinants include vital services that promote health, education, and selfsufficiency. The vision is for 100% of New Mexico families to thrive, and the mission is to build the capacity of each community to provide access to ten vital services for surviving and thriving. By ensuring that communities have accessible, family-friendly environments filled with vital services, we can reduce adverse childhood experiences that can lead to trauma, substance use disorders, violence, injury, and fatalities. The goal of Anna, Age Eight is to provide local stakeholders with a collective impact framework that transforms adverse social determinants of health into positive ones by strengthening the capacity of local service organizations with a focus on: Medical/Dental Care, Behavioral Healthcare, Food Security Programs, Housing Security Programs, Transportation, Parent Supports, Early Childhood Learning, Community Schools, Youth Mentor Programs, and Job Training.

ADVANCING SOCIAL EQUITY

100% Initiatives in 2023

In 2023, we celebrated the Advancing Social Equity Initiative Fellowship of Cohort 2. The Advancing Social Equity Initiative (ASEI) Fellowship is rooted in building the capacity of non-profits in Southern New Mexico by weaving evidenced-informed Equity Models into the fabrics of community organizations. ASEI is a program presented by the Aprendamos and Covarrubias Family Fund in partnership with the Aprendamos Team, Ivy Child International and the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico. Our 2022-2023 cohort included Bold Futures (leading policy change, research, place-based organizing, and culture shift by and for women and people of color in NM), Play Sharity (helping families and children experience how the charitable act of sharing resources and talents leads to a healthier community), and Aprendamos Family of Services (providing early intervention services for children and families).

The the future of ASEI is to amplify the voices and multiply the leadership opportunities for Our Youth/Nuestra Juventad, with a special focus on prioritizing BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color) students and/or students who represent and are from historically marginalized and outlying communities in Southern New Mexico.







GIVING TO THE CAUSES CLOSEST TO YOUR HEART

There is a profound impact when we unite for a common purpose. A giving circle serves as a heart of change and is led and driven by community voice to bring community together to give to causes nominated and voted on by community participants. The 100 Who Give Giving Circle Committee is housed with your Community Foundation. Through 100 Who Give, you'll find camaraderie and shared passion as community members pool together to support vital projects and organizations within our community. Together, we're not just donors; we're change-makers. Every contribution, big or small, becomes part of a powerful wave of philanthropy that directly shapes the future of our community.

In 2023, 100 Who Give hosted four giving circles which raised \$9,000 and supported four local nonprofits! 

CANAAN BOWER LEGACY FOUNDATION

As we honor our loved one's legacy, we carry forward their light, love, and wisdom, ensuring that their impact continues to spark hope and inspire positive change in the world.

The Canaan Bower Legacy Fund was established in 2023 in Memory of Canaan Bower. Canaan was a fantastic human being. In March of 2020, Canaan was recognized on an international scale for interceding in an attempted kidnapping at a gas station in Las Cruces, NM. Because of his actions, the would-be kidnapper was apprehended and a pregnant mom and her three young children were saved. Canaan used the skills he gained through wrestling at Mayfield High School, where he was heavy-weight District Champion and a two time State qualifier. Canaan was more than a one-time hero. He exemplified love and kindness every day of his life with everyone he ever met. Canaan was known for helping out friends, family and strangers any time they needed help. He was a friend to all, and a protector for many. On March 9, 2022, Canaan lost his life in a motorcycle/car accident. Canaan will always be loved, never forgotten and forever missed. The Canaan Bower Legacy Fund will be used primarily to provide support for student wrestlers within Doña Ana County public high schools, support of wrestling programming at Mayfield High School, and support in caring for our unhoused neighbors throughout Doña Ana County.

When we lost Canaan our world was flipped upside down. We spent the next few months trying to catch our breath but one of the things is that we had a vision of wanting to help others in honoring Canaan's legacy. Partnering with the Community Foundation has just been so instrumental. They are local. They are people that know us, know our son, and our story. It's very important for us to try to strengthen our community because we know how important it is to have a strong community.








BILLY SALOPEK AND MARY SALOPEK

JON WYNNE IMPACTING GENERATIONS OF STUDENTS AT DOÑA ANA COMMUNITY COLLEGE



2023 marked a historical year for one of our scholarship funds while continuing to build upon a long-time and cherished relationship with our partners at Doña Ana Community College (DACC). As the Community College marked their 50th Anniversary in our community, we celebrate a 10-year partnership with DACC in supporting students. This partnership is due to one dedicated CFSNM volunteer and passionate community leader, Jon Wynne. Jon left a legacy that will never be forgotten, and lives continue to be changed through the Jon Wynne Scholarship, which was created in 2013.

Wynne was born on August 21, 1931 in London. He was an avid reader and fond of films and filmmakers. Wynne loved to engage in intellectual conversations and political discussions. His insights into human nature were astute and helped him as he dialogued with friends and colleagues. His keen, dry sense of humor was embraced by many who knew and loved him. Wynne spent the majority of his career as an auditor for the American Tobacco Company based in New York City. It was when he retired to the warmer climate of Las Cruces that he became a community volunteer dedicated to social change and philanthropy. While not a native New Mexican, a large portion of his time was spent serving his new community and addressing its needs.

Jon Wynne Scholarship Recipients Wynne started volunteering with the CFSNM nearly two decades before he passed away, first at the Memorial Medical Center Foundation and then the Healthcare Foundation of Southern New Mexico. Every morning, Monday through Friday, Wynne would arrive at the CFSNM office at 5 am working until 9 am on bookkeeping and various needs within the offices.

All of the staff enjoyed his presence and dedication to the organization's success. CFSNM was certainly lucky to have a volunteer as devoted as Wynne. CFSNM staff were appreciative of his hard work and the time he gave so willingly; the gift of time is just as valuable as charitable contributions.

Wynne passed away on September 26, 2011 at the age of 80, and upon his passing, he left a large planned gift through a bequest in his will. He left his estate to the CFSNM to create the Jon Wynne Scholarship.

Post-high school education was critically important to Jon. His planned gift wishes are a testament to that. The Jon Wynne Scholarship provides dollars annually which are matched by current scholarships at DACC. Students will see a doubling of their scholarship dollars when the Jon Wynne Scholarship matches a scholarship they receive. Over 1,000 DACC students have been awarded the Jon Wynne Scholarship since 2013. The power of estate planning can truly ripple through our communities for generations to come. We are honored to stand in partnership with DACC while continuing to support community college students in their dreams and aspirations. Jon's impact and the story of his life are ever important to our work, and we are proud to share his legacy each and every year.
